Srinagar: An online workshop on psychosocial counselling was held at the University of Kashmir. The day-long workshop titled "Guidance for psychosocial counselling and Covid Helper Skills' was jointly organised by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE) and KU's office of National Service Scheme for NSS program officers of Kashmir division to help them understand the challenges faced by student volunteers and program officers in reaching out to help the Covid19 victims.

Gender-based violence is preventable but it will continue to exist if some of the fundamental concerns are not addressed with a sense of urgency, a top legal expert has said.

Addressing an online talk 'Sexual Violence: Laws and Remedies', organised by Kashmir University's National Service Scheme (NSS), Sanchita Ain, Advocate on Record in the Supreme Court, referred to various forms of gender-based violence and explained how legal remedies can help the victims to get access to justice.

"Sexual violence is a form of gender-based violence. A holistic approach is needed to nip the evil of gender-based violence in the bud. We need to create safe opportunities for women to share their experiences while creating a culture of speaking out and breaking the silence collectively," she said, referring to various factors responsible for gender-based violence, various types of gender-based violence, and legal remedial measures available to address such cases.

According to a statement, Ain also spoke at length on measures specifically taken on orders of high courts in different states and UTs of the country, including J&K, to fight against gender-based violence amid disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. These, she said, include designating safer spaces and setting up of help-lines for victims of gender-based violence.

She stressed on the need to follow the best practices in other countries to prevent it. "We also need to support and take support of community organisations for better outcomes," she said.

The lecture, apart from academics, was attended by students of University of Kashmir, and was followed by a question-answer session.

Dr Musavir Ahmad, Programme Coordinator of NSS at KU said such lectures help raise awareness on matters of great societal importance.

"It is the continued endeavor of the NSS to hold lectures on important issues with the larger objective of raising awareness among the masses," he said.

Dr Shazia conducted proceedings of the online lecture, while Dr Heena presented a vote of thanks.



The NSS, University of Kashmir organised a webinar on the occasion of the World Human Rights Day which is celebrated on the 10th of December every year. Around 200 NSS volunteers participated in the webinar.

He suggested that district judges should be given the powers to entertain petitions under the Constitution's Article-32, which gives the right to individuals to move the Supreme Court if they feel their right "unduly deprived". to justice has been "This would ensure accessibility of weaker sections of the society to justice and make human rights more meaningful," he said. Dr Khalid Hassan, Coordinator, Department of Politics and Governance, Central University of Kashmir, critically evaluated the influence of western philosophical thought on human rights jurisprudence.

In his message for the webinar, Coordinator NSS Dr Musavir Ahmed said the Covid-19 pandemic has posed new challenges vis-à-vis protection of human rights of marginalised sections of society.

Srinagar, Feb 06 (KND): Vice-Chancellor of University of Kashmir Prof Talat Ahmad on Saturday inaugurated a road safety signaturi campaign that aims to encourage people to drive safely and help prevent road accidents.

According to a statement issued to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KND), the week-long programme has been organised by the varsity's National Service Scheme (NSS) in collaboration with J&K Traffic Police Department.
