## **Brief Report**

### Five one-week Training cum Orientation Programs for NSS Program Officers of J&K, conducted under the aegis of Empanelled Training Institute (ETI), National Service Scheme (NSS), University of Kashmir, Srinagar



The Office of Program Coordinator, NSS, University of Kashmir was designated as an ETI by an MOU signed between University of Kashmir and Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports vide No.P-19/NSS/RDD/2018-2019/914-916, dated 13<sup>th</sup> February, 2019.

The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India had sanctioned seven oneweek training programs to the Empanelled Training Institute (ETI), Program Coordinator, National Service Scheme (NSS), University of Kashmir vide sanction letter F. No. L – 13022/3 (ii)/2019-NSS, dated 30/09/2021,for the financial year 2021-22. Out of the total sanctioned grant of Rs. 18, 06,000 (Rs. 258, 000 for each) for the seven programs, an amount of Rs. 1354,500 was released as first installment. The remaining 25% and Rs. 46,053 (under ST category) shall be released after the submission of Utilization Certificate (UT) for the funds. Due to intermittent Covid-19 lockdowns in the UT during the period, the office was able to conduct only 05 training programs successfully.

A communication vide No.F/NSS/ETI/KU/21/ 328, dated 17/02/2021 was sent to Director Colleges, J&K who is also the State Nodal Officer (SNO) for NSS for deputation of NSS program officers (35 for each) from various colleges and higher secondary schools of UT and accordingly the SNO deputed program officers from colleges of Jammu and Kashmir divisions. To facilitate the participation of out-station program officers, a provision for accommodation was made for them at Sheikh Hamzah Guest house of the University.
